*This Week's Torah Reading*

**IN THIS WEEK'S PARSHA**, Moshe inform the B'nei Yisroel that they may choose between receiving Hashem's blessings for observing His commandments, or suffer His curse for rejecting His laws. A ceremony would be held on the mountains of Gerizim and Eival, immediately after entering Eretz Yisroel, during which the consequences of the blessing and the curse would be pronounced.

**MOSHE THEN TURNS** to the exposition of a number of religious, civil, and social laws which regulate the life of the nation in the Promised Land. He first deals with the principle of centralized worship, which directs against the idolatrous practice of individual worship, at any site. All sacrifices are to be brought only to the place chosen by G-d. Those portions of offerings permitted to the lay worshipper are to be eaten there. However, an animal intended for ordinary consumption, rather than for a sacrifice, could be slaughtered and eaten anywhere, provided its blood was not consumed.

**THE BNEI YISROEL** are warned not to imitate the hideous rites of the Canaanites, such as sacrificing living children to their gods. The false prophet who attempted to entice them to worship idols was to be put to death, as well as all the inhabitants of a city, after being investigated and convicted of idol worship. The city was then totally destroyed by fire.

**AS A HOLY PEOPLE**, Israelites are to refrain from eating anything abominable. Moshe, therefore, reviews the dietary laws already revealed at Sinai. He discusses a second Ma'aser, consisting of a tenth of one's annual produce of the soil including grain, wine and oil to be brought by every Jewish man to the Sanctuary, and consumed by him there. Anyone living too far away from the Sanctuary, could bring the monetary valued of the Ma'aser Sheini instead, purchase food there with the money, and enjoy a festive meal with his family and the Levi'im. At the end of every 3rd and 6th year of the Shemitta cycle, this tenth was to be given to the poor, (Ma'aser Oni) at home rather than going to the Sanctuary.

**AT THE END** of every seventh (Shemitta) year, during which the land is to remain fallow, a creditor is to release his fellow Jews from any loans which may be due. Yet, this should not discourage anyone from lending money to the needy, for such acts of kindness will be repaid by Hashem.

**IN ADDITION**, a Hebrew slave who had been sold into bondage is to be freed at the beginning of the 7th year, and liberally assisted with material means to enable him to make

a fresh start on life. If the slave should choose to remain in his master's service, his ear is to be pierced, as a sign that he selected slavery rather than freedom, contrary to G-d's wishes.

**IN AMPLIFYING THE** laws of the Feasts of Pesach, Shavuot, and Succot, Moshe emphasized that every male Israelite was to make a pilgrimage three times a year to the Sanctuary, bringing with him sacrifices, each person according to his means.

A highly energetic couple, the Reich's decided they wanted to pursue a life in the pulpit rabbinate early on in their personal and professional lives. They are thrilled to be here and part of Congregation Adat Yeshurun and joining our community.
